



This year we are launching "St. Jeanne Jugan Days." We thought it fitting to celebrate this time between our foundress' feast day and her birthday. As St. Jeanne Jugan would have done, we'd like to offer a way to connect with our mission of care for the elderly poor.

A SAINT FOR THE ELDERLY POOR Just one year ago, she was declared a Saint! Little Sisters of the Poor around the world celebrated. Jeanne Jugan called us to serve the elderly in need. Today over 2,000 Little Sisters fulfill this mission.

CONTINUING ST. JEANNE JUGAN'S HUMBLE VISION In the mid-1800's, St. Jeanne Jugan began taking the elderly poor into her own home. She believed that no one should ever die alone. St. Jeanne Jugan gave herself entirely to God and the elderly poor, and we have done so here in Cincinnati since 1868.

A TRADITION OF CARE With basket in hand, St. Jeanne Jugan walked all over France begging for support; she did it for the poor, and for God. Yes, the elderly in our care need the same things they did in St. Jeanne Jugan's era. Healthcare, food, clothing, warmth, and most of all – love. Costs and requirements for this care have increased, and we ask for support as our foundress would have.

ST. JEANNE JUGAN DAYS This year, we launch St. Jeanne Jugan Days – from August  $30^{th}$  – October  $30^{th}$  – days dedicated to 'Living the Vision of St. Jeanne Jugan' (our 2010 theme) and the many practical ways she sought support for the elderly poor.

**MEETING PRACTICAL NEEDS** In honor of her first year of Sainthood, we follow St. Jeanne Jugan's humble example – asking for resources to sustain daily care for nearly 100 elderly poor here at St. Paul's Home. *OUR GOAL*: \$47,000 (This number honors the age – 47 years old - of Jeanne Jugan when she established the Little Sisters of the Poor.)
